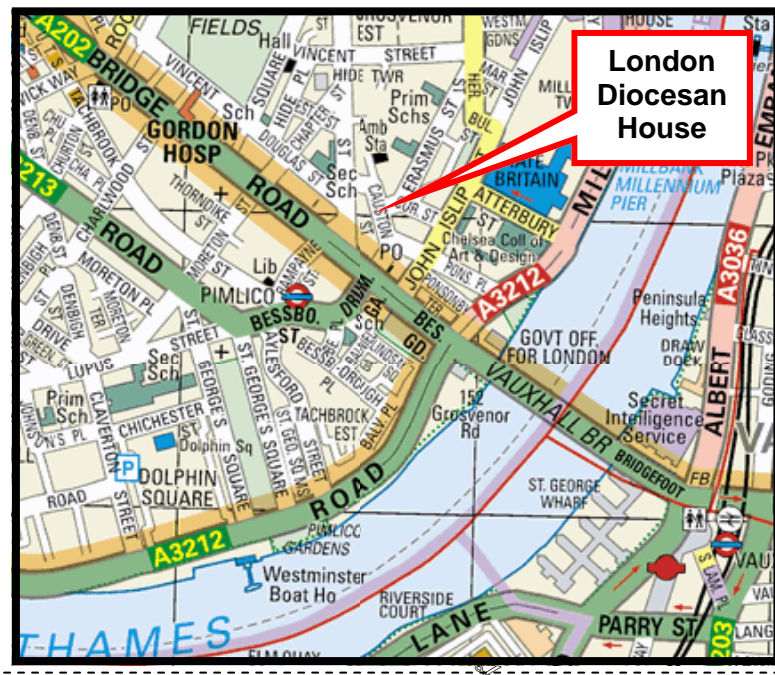


Finding us

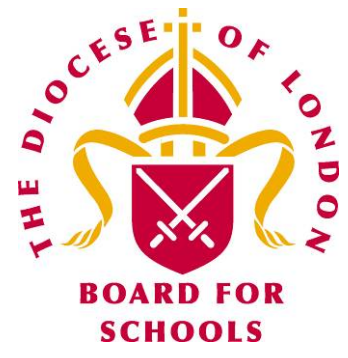

The Day

Many schools and parishes in London have had great success using Godly Play as a way of engaging children with sacred stories. This day course will give you an introduction to the method and give you the basic grounding you need to begin.

Participants can experience key elements of the Godly Play approach (including one or two stories), see a carefully laid out children's sacred space and explore many of the resources. The group size is small, so ideal for asking all your questions.

What is Godly Play

The Heart of Godly Play

- Creating Sacred Space
- Building and working in community
- Learning religious language
- Using religious language to make meaning

A Godly Play session includes a time to:-

- get ready
- tell a story using objects and artefacts
- explore the story more with open questions and discussion
- respond with a free choice using a variety of materials - art... silence... play...writing...
- enjoy a simple feast and sharing
